Invitation

Pastor: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Pastor: Lift up your hearts to the Lord.

People: It is right to give God our thanks and praise.

Pastor: Let us proclaim our faith in God and in his Son, Jesus the Christ, our Lord, our brother, our Savior.

All: We come before him, thankful for all his love, grace and mercy.

Liturgy for the Bread

Pastor: Most Holy, merciful and loving God, as we gather around this table to celebrate the birth and life of Jesus, prepare us to take this bread, remembering Jesus, who in sacrificial love laid down his life for our sake.

People: With the shepherds in Bethlehem, we will eat this bread. May it fill us with renewed faith in God and our salvation through Christ.

Pastor: For to us a Child is Born. To us a Son is given. His name is Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

People: The mystery of this table, the awesome mystery of cradle and cross, fills our hearts, and hope for the salvation of God's creation is awakened.

Pastor: Even at the moment of His miraculous birth, the seed of His betrayal and death was sown, so that in the Upper Room of His betrayal, Jesus' Christmas legacy was fulfilled. It was there that Jesus took bread, gave thanks, blessed it and gave it to His disciples saying; *"Take and eat, this is my body broken for you. Do this in remembrance of me."*

Liturgy for the Cup

Pastor: God of everlasting love and grace, as we draw near to the lowly manger where Mary placed the child Jesus, the awesome reality of your love still elusive, yet miraculous, we bow to worship the Christ Child, bathed in the light of the star and the shadow of the cross.

People: Here, at this communion table may we breathe in the awesome majesty of the story---the story of surprised shepherds, innkeepers, and singing angels, and a baby's birth---all bringing to mind how you, Glorious God, are born into our lives.

Pastor: This cup reminds us of the One whose life teaches us the truth about ourselves and our salvation; Whose blood is poured out for our sake; Whose resurrection gives us hope for all eternity.

People: In this season of giving, we remember how much we have been given. Accept our offering of ourselves, O God, as we come with grateful hearts.

Pastor: Again we move from the stable of Christmas to the Upper Room of Good Friday. There, as he had done with the bread, Jesus took the Cup, blessed it, and said: "*This is the Cup of the New Covenant, poured out in my blood for the forgiveness of sins. Drink this Cup in remembrance of me.*" On this most Holy Night we remember, that apart from the sacrifice of Good Friday and the Miracle of Easter—Christmas has no meaning.

People: Lord, pour your blessing upon these gifts and upon us. AMEN!
